This year it was to the Yorkshire Dales. Whilst there, they carried out fieldwork to investigate the unique limestone landforms of the area, river landforms, the social economic opportunities provided by the area and the management issues faced by National Park. They visited many classic features and were impressed by the dramatic sites of Gaping Gill, Malham Cove and Gordale Scar. They were also able to view the interesting underground formations including Stalactites and Stalagmites in a public show cave. Their information gathering was greatly assisted by a session with a National Park ranger, who brought to life the issues faced in managing a very busy tourist area.

Apart from one heavy downpour the weather was largely kind to them and they all returned enthused for the variety of the British landscape and with detailed information to recall for their studies.
